Purpose

Reception- Amazing Animals

Driving question: How do animals grow and change over time?

In this topic, we are learning to:

Understand how creatures grow and change over time.

Key questions:

What's in the egg? Why are eggs warm? What can we observe? What is an egg? What is the life cycle of a duckling? How can we care for the ducklings? What rules should we follow? What farm animals do we know of? What wild animals in the UK do we know of? How are these different from farm animals? What pets can we keep? How do we care for them? What different types of animals live around the world? How are they suited to their environment? Can the children understand camouflage? What do the terms nocturnal and diurnal mean? Using our learning from this term, can we create a care package for looking after ducklings?

What can you do at home to help?

Choose one (or more!) of the three homework tasks to support your child's learning within this topic (this will be sent home separately). Model using the key vocabulary (please see below) at home too!
